






Eventually a crime of desire leads to a rally cry.


"I will see the head of who ever did this on a stick!!!!"


If crime is constant and there is no investigation or punishment, society is spiraling downward into anarchy.







When a crime occurs if you want justice, or punishment, an investigation must be launched.







If an investigation alone is enough to make the individual criminal stop offending, they may never be found or get punished.







If even in the presence of a much publicized investigation the criminal does not stop the desire for increasingly severe punishment grows in proportion to the crime wave.







Once a system of punishment has been established the more investigators that are assigned the faster the criminal will be brought to justice causing individual crimes to stop.





No matter how much punishment is threatened if no one investigates, or if fewer investigators are made available crime will increase.





This is the process by which the group establishes appropriate punishments based on the nature of offences.

Once established the group moves into the next phase of development.
